

Architectural Review Board

Benjamin Franklin is quoted as saying "The doors of wisdom are never shut." If you agree with Ben, the Architectural Review Board hopes you are receptive to our thoughts and observations regarding, well, doors.

Door handles, locks, door knockers, doorbell buttons, street numbers and front door kick plates throughout the OTV townhome community are starting to show their age. While many residents have nicely maintained or even replaced some of these items above, many of us have not and we should really take a close look as spring approaches. The "before" and "after" photos below may motivate you to replace your door hardware. What a difference!





Rear street numbers above our garages fall into this category, too, and some are looking a little neglected: chipped paint, broken or missing numbers, etc.

Changes to door hardware are allowed, provided it is similar to the original hardware installed by the developer.

A storm or screen door is allowed in the townhomes, provided that the door is a metal frame type with maximum glass insert. The color of the frame should match or be coordinated with the color of the home entrance. Brass trim should be used to match the trim of the main door. Explicitly ruled out are wooden doors, doors with a grid insert or metal strip at half height, nonblack doors that don't match the color of the main door, doors with Plexiglas insert, etc. ARB approval is required for storm door installations.

Now is also an ideal time to paint both the interior and exterior of the front door. Take an honest look at the door frame and trim while you're at it. Is your welcome mat worn out? Even if you're not especially gifted in home repairs, most of these items are relatively inexpensive and can be replaced by the homeowner.

Pretty soon you've beautified a public space that welcomes friends and neighbors to your home. Ol' Ben would approve!

Safety & Security

PARKING: Distribution of the new townhome parking decals and car guest passes has been pushed back to April 16th. Any vehicle not displaying the decals or guest passes after a brief grace period may be ticketed. This effort is being undertaken because,

over the years, information detailing which decals/passes belongs to which resident has been lost.

To receive your new parking decals, you must fill out a form with your contact information, as well as information about your vehicles. The completed form must be sent to Ron Purdy of Legum & Norman by mail, email, fax or online. Ron's contact information is on the form.

There are several methods for obtaining the form:

- All townhome residents will receive an email with a link to the form, which provides instructions on how to obtain your new parking decals and guest passes. Print, complete and return the form per instructions.
- If you do not have email or if you prefer to submit the information the old fashion way, paper forms are available in the Roundhouse fover.
- In addition, a similar electronic form may be filled out on the OTVOA website by clicking here.

Parking decals and guest passes will be distributed at the Roundhouse on Thursday, **April 16** between **7 and 9 pm**. Residents may come to the Roundhouse on this date and time with filled out forms to receive their decals/passes. But it will be more efficient if forms are completed and returned to Ron prior to the distribution date. Please avoid filling out forms at the distribution session as this will greatly delay the process. A follow up distribution session will be held between **10 and 12 on Saturday, April 25**.

LIGHTING: Residents continue to improve lighting in darkened areas of our community. The dark areas of the alleys are much improved due to the distribution of free lights for the below-deck exterior lights. These lights are bright but also very energy efficient (14 Watts). They have automatic light sensors that are built-in and thus turn on at dusk and turn off at dawn. Just leave your light switch "on" all the time and the light takes care of the rest. If you want one, call Steve Cragg (703-535-1123) and he will pro-

vide you with free lights, which you can install or he will install for you. Please alert Steve of dark areas in the alleys or elsewhere in your vicinity if you notice them.

ATTEMPTED BREAK-IN: An unsuccessful break-in was attempted at a townhome on S. Henry St. while residents were away. Pry marks were found on the outside front door. The townhome did not appear to have been entered as nothing was found missing. Police were summoned and areas around the pry marks were dusted for fingerprints. No one has been apprehended at this time. Please report home or car break-ins or parcel thefts to the police. In this instance, the non-emergency police numbers (703-746-4444 and 703-746-1870) were answered only by a recording, but the residents did get through by calling 911. In the event of a break-in, attempted or otherwise (including cars), or parcel thefts outside homes, first call police, then inform a member of the Safety and Security Committee (Steve Cragg: 703-535-1123 or Jim Larocco: 703-684-1984). Home security systems may be installed by vendors such as C&C Homations (301-670-9775) or ADT (877-736-2558). Other security services are available on the Web by searching "home security services."

For many years, the two cut throughs on Duke and Henry Streets have been used by unwanted intruders to elude police and to steal packages from the rear of a residence. The police have recommended planting thorn bushes in the cut throughs to prevent intruders from using these entry and escape routes. The SSC decided to make a formal request to the OTVOA Board to instruct the OTVOA Grounds & Services

Committee to contract for the planting of these bushes. In addition, motion sensor lights may be installed to illuminate the cut throughs when someone enters and thus further deter use by non-residents.

From the OTVCUOA Board of Directors

The OTVC Board of Directors' February 17 meeting was cancelled due to inclement weather. The next board meeting will be held on **Tuesday, March 10** at **7** pm in the Roundhouse.

Replacement Reserve Study

In the near future the board plans to enter into a contract for the completion of a replacement reserve study. The last Old Town Village Condominium Replacement Reserve Report 2013 was completed on November 12, 2012. The purpose of the study is to provide the association with an inventory of the common community facilities and infrastructure components that require periodic replacement. The study includes a general view of the condition of these items and an effective financial plan to fund projected periodic replacements.

Of note, the Virginia Condominium Act requires condominium associations to conduct a study at least once every five years to determine the necessity and amount of reserves required to repair, replace and restore its capital components.

This year's study needs to be a Level 1 Full Replacement Reserve Study due to the fact that the last two studies that were done in September 2007 and November 2012 were both Level 2 updates. The board plans to ask the company that is selected to do the study to add some of the more costly maintenance items to the reserve study, i.e., painting of building interiors, tree trimming, etc. By including some of the maintenance items, the board feels that the association will be in better position to plan and budget for these types of expenditures.

Interior Painting of Hallways and Lobbies

The interior painting project has gone extremely well and is progressing ahead of schedule. Many residents feel that the paint design brings a more contemporary look to the affected areas. The board plans on following through with a couple of other recommendations made by Chic Creative, the OTVC design consultant on

this project, namely:

- Changing the hallway lighting to better modernize the overall appearance and
- Installation of a small security mirror in the corner adjacent to the mailbox receptacles.

The board also plans on replacing all of the emergency exit and elevator signs in order to better complement the overall interior renovation.

Balcony Renovation

Mr. Steve Turner from Building Envelope Consultants and Scientists LLC (BECS) recently arranged for a "prebid" meeting with six of the pre-approved potential contractors who might be selected to do the actual work on some of the building's wooden balconies. The meeting was on site and included a walk through of some balconies. Mr. Turner, Mrs. Cornwell, OTVC Board President Cheryl Van Coverden and representatives from the six companies attended the meeting. The group was very appreciative to those unit owners who were willing to allow the group access to their units, which enabled inspection of different balconies on the upper floors of the building.

The Request for Proposals (RFP) for this project calls for bids to be submitted by February 23. Next steps in the project will be 1) a recommendation by BECS to the board on which firm should do the work and 2) a final determination by BECS and the board as to which components of the project should be undertaken. A copy of the Request for Proposals, which includes the project specifications, will be put on the Associations' web site once a firm has been selected.

Board Vacancy

The board has accepted the resignation of Board Secretary Michelle Stark, effective February 27, 2015. Michelle and Richard have sold their unit in preparation for transitioning toward retirement. Michelle has been a real asset to the board and the community and she will be truly

IMPORTANT HOT WATER HEATER NEWS!

If you haven't heard by now, here's some important information, which might affect you if you are considering replacing your hot water heater.

In an effort to improve efficiency, the National Appliance Energy Conservation Act (NAECA) will impact the design and efficiency of new water heaters. These new government mandated water heater regulations will start on **April 16th, 2015**. This means that all products manufactured after this date must meet the new regulations.

The new regulations mean the physical units will be larger, thus presenting potential problems for homeowners with older water heaters currently operating

in tight spaces.

INTERESTING WINTER FACTS

- The Winter of 1779 1780 was so cold that ice was piled 20 feet high along the Delmarva Coast and stayed there until spring. The upper portion of the Chesapeake Bay and the entire Potomac River was frozen solid, allowing people to walk from Annapolis to Kent Island and from Alexandria in to D.C.
- The coldest temperature ever recorded in the world was -128 degrees C (-198.4 F), in Vostok Station in Antarctica in 1983.
- According to the Guinness Book of World Records, the largest snowflake ever observed fell in Fort Keogh, Montana on January 28, 1887. It was 15" wide and 8" thick!
- The all-time world record for the largest snowfall in a single day was set in the United States on December 4, 1913, when Georgetown, Colorado received a staggering 63 inches of snow – more than five feet.
