Cyber Safety Community Meeting - Our Cyber Safety

Cyber Crime Seminar September 24

Condos and Townhomes Welcome to Attend Seminar will be held in the Roundhouse on Wed, Sept 24 at 7:00 pm. This is open to both the Townhomes and Condos. We will cover phishing, fraud calls, texts

and emails and other issues relating to AI technology. This seminar was well attended a couple of years ago so get there on time if you would like to ensure you get a seat. Sean Kanuck of the Condos and hopefully, a detective from Alexandria Police will be on the panel. Either way we hope to see you there. We will send an email to the community in a few weeks with details.

Lock Your Vehicles and Use your Garage - While cybercrime is probably more of a monetary threat, we are still having vehicles broken into in OTV. One neighbor admittedly did not lock their vehicle, and the car was rummaged through overnight. Assume your car is "cased" by nighttime "entrepreneurs" if it is parked outside your garage. Never leave anything of value visible in the car. Please watch out for your neighbors and let them know if they have left their garage or other doors open.

Back to School - Please remember as the days get shorter heading into Fall, we have children and families walking to and from school when the lighting is not great. Our speed limit is 17 MPH throughout OTV and please drive slowly to look for kids and other folks crossing the streets and while backing out of your garage.

Parking - As more folks are back in town, visitor spots are at a premium, please use your garage as a first option, park under your deck if you must do so and do not impede the fire lanes. We will have increased enforcement for cars not showing an OTV sticker or hang tag as well as being in the same visitor spots for more than 2 weeks at a time. If you have a large vehicle that you cannot fit in your garage, you might want to consider getting a city parking permit to park on S. Henry, Wilkes, or the 200 block of S. Payne Street near Duke St. Remember, if you buy a new vehicle and/or sell an old one, email CFM to get your registration updated with the HOA, so we can contact you if needed and have your parking sticker visible. If your rear window it tinted, put the sticker on the front left side of the windshield to avoid confusion.

Grounds and Services

As we transition out of summer and into the fall season, it's a good time to consider fall-to-winter planting. When selecting plants or shrubs, it's important to choose those that can withstand cooler temperatures and potentially frosty conditions. In Northern Virginia, temperatures average around 80°F with lows around 60°F. This is an ideal time to plant perennials and shrubs. Below are some recommendations, but as always, your local garden nursery can be the best source of information for the area.

Ornamental Plants

Perennials

- Hellebores: Bloom in late winter to early spring, providing early color
- Sedum: Hardy and adds texture to winter gardens

- Boxwood: Evergreen and provides structure throughout the winter
- Winterberry Holly: Bright red berries add color and attract birds.

Administrative - We continue to meet with prospective contractors for the community irrigation upgrade. The current system is over 20 years old, and the last upgrade happened 13 years ago. This upgrade would be a significant capital investment for the community, addressing the aging system and improving water control in sun and shade areas. Additionally, it could provide potential savings of up to 60% in water usage.

The Trash and Recycling contract with Trash Away is due to expire at the end of the year. We are working with the contractor on a new contract.

We extend our gratitude to the OTV residents who have reported issues, as it helps us address them promptly. The G&S Committee greatly appreciates your efforts in looking out for our community.

Annual Home Inspections - At the time this article was submitted, the ARB's goal was to complete the 2025 home inspections before Labor Day and issue any violation notices. Notices will be emailed via HOALife. Please check your junk mail to ensure you did not receive a notice.

All emails generated through HOALife will come from "Old Town Village OA". If a property doesn't have an email on file, a first-class letter will be sent.

Homeowners may receive more than one violation notice. This is because there are many different types of violations with different resolutions and cure periods. The HOALife system tracks each of these different violations separately.

Homeowners can respond to violations within the HOALife system. The violation notice will provide the website address, and you can log on by entering your full street address (e.g., XXX South Payne Street) and the violation number on the notice. You can even attach photos to your response.

Unfortunately, there are still a number of 2024 inspection violations that have not been resolved. For the one's that the homeowner has reached out to the ARB, the resolution date has been extended to 9/30/25. Reminder notices will be sent to those who have not contacted the ARB. In a few cases, the nature of the violation will result in a second formal notice being sent.

Application to Install SolaTube Tubular Skylights -

The new owner of 1109 Roundhouse Lane has applied to install two SolaTube tubular skylights on their home. The ARB has scheduled a meeting for Wednesday September 17th to review this application. A formal notice with complete details of the application will be sent prior to the meeting. For more information on these skylights visit solatube.com/residential/.

As you may have noticed, our mailboxes around the community received a refresh this summer. Our reserves study had funds for replacing the mailboxes after 25+ years of wear and tear. However, after committee discussions it was decided that cleaning, painting, and new number decals could do the trick. We engaged with the painter that did such a good job on the clock in front of the Roundhouse and now these prominent fixtures in our community look much better.

We are now reaching out to companies to get quotes for sealcoating our asphalt streets. When we spoke with pavement companies last year, they all recommended after 1-2 years to get the asphalt sealcoated to preserve the surface as long as possible. You may notice if you look closely enough the original emulsification is beginning to wear away. Sealcoating extends the life of the surface from cracking. It's hard to believe that it's already been a year since the roads were repaved.

We will be out surveying the brick sidewalks this fall. We have probably the most level and safest brick sidewalks in all of Old Town and we want to keep it that way. 
From the OTVCUOA President

Barbie Frank, President School has opened and Fall is coming. I hope everyone has enjoyed their summer. The pool is still open for a couple more weeks, so be sure to take advantage of the warm weather!

Gates - The gates continue to be a challenge, with the east-side gate experiencing all of the damage! We are still in negotiations with the owner of the car that caused the extensive damage back in February. This is now in the hands of the OTVC attorney.

A few reminders about the gates

- 1. If you raise both gates, please try to drive through the middle to ensure that both gates come back down at the same time.
- 2. The last two times the gate hit a car, the drivers were both clearly community resident, since video shows the drivers raising the gate with their remotes after the gate hit their cars. We have pictures and are asking both Sentry and





CFM to identify the drivers via the license plate numbers. If one or both drivers see this and decide to self-identify, please contact your Management Company representative. The gate still operates but is bent

- 3. The lesson to be learned from this is never assume you can get through if the gate is already raised. You rarely can; that is why we all have remote. Please use it!
- 4. Also please note: if you cause damage and the gate must be repaired or replaced, you are responsible for the repair/replacement expense.
- 5. If you see someone who is waiting for the gate to be opened so they can try to piggyback, I suggest hesitating after you pass through in order to be sure the gate comes down behind you and blocks the waiting car. If you are walking by and see someone waiting, it is helpful if you can point out the sign redirecting the driver to a different entry/exit. Please note, we are not asking anyone to confront another driver.

Dryer Vents - The deadline for completing this task has passed and only about a dozen units are out of compliance as of press time. If you are one of these out-of-compliance owner, please take care of this requirement ASAP. If you are a renter and this task has not been completed, please contact your landlord about it ASAP. This policy is in place because clogged dryer vents are a fire hazard and put your neighbors and yourself at risk. Thank you to everyone who has already taken care of this.

Glass Recycling - The Board has received a proposal to start recycling glass in the community. The program will cost about \$4,000 per year. Every resident should have received an email containing a link to a survey to assess community interest in glass recycling. An article and link to the survey is also included in this edition of the Crier. The Board will make a decision at the September 16th meeting.

Annual Homeowners' Meeting - Please mark your calendars: OTVC's annual homeowners' meeting will be held in place of our regular meeting on Tuesday, November 18. Further information and a call for nominations will be sent out in early October. Two positions are expiring with the November meeting, President (Barbie Frank) and Memeber-at-Large (Robin Famighetti). At this point in time, I plan to run again, and Robin has indicated that she will as well. We do, of course, welcome additional nominations!

We have been in discussions with a company called Love4Glass that comes highly recommended. The Board has gotten a quote from the company, in which it proposes to provide OTVC with three

large bins (e.g., 45-gallon bin) for our community with a cost of \$155 for a bi-weekly pickup of all of the bins.

This is estimated to cost approximately \$3,720 annually. We hope that residents will be willing to fill in the following survey and allow the Board to gauge community interest in this service.

2. Roundhouse Front Door – Access System Issues
There continues to be problems with the
fob/cell phone reader that controls access to the
Roundhouse front door. We are pressing Kastle
(who provides access system monitoring and
maintenance services) to try to resolve these
recurring problems ASAP. We have expressed our
dissatisfaction with Kastle attempts to make the
system reliable again. We are working through
Kastle's Director of Customer Service on this
problem. In the meantime, we are getting pricing
and installation timeframe to replace the Kastle
system with a simple key pad system. We will let
you know if Management Committee determines if
this is a step we need to take.

- 3. **Gym Users** Many OTV residents regularly use the Roundhouse gym equipment to work out. We are lucky to have this gym available for our use. We rely on equipment users to leave the equipment they use in good condition for the next user. Please be sure to clean/wipe down the equipment that you use at the end of your work out. Thank you!

Cancer survivor, Komen leader to share children's book at Alexandria event

Paula Schneider, a breast cancer survivor and leader with the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, will discuss her new children's book "Love Stays Strong" during a Sept. 3 event at Old Town Books.

The 7 p.m. presentation will feature Schneider alongside Karin Purugganan, a licensed professional counselor in Alexandria. The event will take place at Old Town Books, 130 S Royal St.

"Love Stays Strong" addresses how families can navigate serious illness together, with a mother explaining her changing body and health condition to her child. The book aims to provide comfort and guidance while reassuring children that family love remains constant despite life's challenges.

Schneider, who serves as CEO of the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation and is a mother of two daughters, wrote the book drawing from her personal experience as a cancer survivor who also lost her mother to metastatic breast cancer. The book features illustrations by Nicole Wong, whose family was also affected by cancer.

"In a beautiful text that all families facing serious illness can relate to, a mother explains her own illness and changing body to her child," according to promotional materials for the book.

Net proceeds from book sales will be donated to the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation, which has invested more than \$3.6 billion in breast cancer research, advocacy and patient support since 1982. The organization reports these investments have helped reduce the breast cancer mortality rate by 44%.

The Komen Foundation was established in 1982 and continues its work in breast cancer research and support services. More information about the foundation is available at komen.org.
